Don't leave town this Canada Day Sutcliffe Park is the *only* place to be



For almost twenty years False Creek community residents have gathered together to celebrate Canada Day. It has always been a family oriented event. The day usually started with a pancake breakfast and a decorated bike parade along the seawall. There were kids' games, team games, pie eating contests, bingo, an outdoor family dance in Leg-in-Boot Square, and a Teddy Bear's picnic.

Over the years the scope of the celebration has ebbed and flowed as organizers and community volunteers came and went. This year there has been a tidal wave of support for our local Canada Day extravaganza, from every nook and cranny of False Creek, the surrounding area and even other parts of B.C. and Canada.

The motley crew of organizers (and all their volunteers and supporters) have been bragging they were going to host one of the greatest Canada Day parties this year. They have pulled out all the stops, cashed in virtually all of the chits for past favours they have done for others, drunk barrels of coffee to keep awake and performed brilliantly.

If you are planning to be anywhere but on Granville Island on Canada Day then you are going to wrong the place.

The main event is the opening of the new kids' water park. We have watched the workers sweating away renovating and expanding the space (oh to be an engineer and wear a white hat and not have to wield a pick

or shovel). The back hoes, the dump trucks and the big tarmac rollers have come and gone. What is left is a play space that even Uncle Scrooge would have fun in - because it's free. It will be a wet and wild place to say the least. We are looking forward to seeing how many of the dignitaries on hand will get soaked by the kids once the water is turned on.

In the Cariboo a team of woodworkers has been busily building thirteen post and beam buildings for the Trans Canada Trail exhibits. Ten of the crew will erect the small buildings on Saturday and Sunday and dismantle them on Tuesday.

By the way if you're looking for the ready-made beginnings of a summer cabin the 10' x 12' structures will be for sale for about \$1,000 each - dismantling included.

Trails B.C. is spearheading this project on behalf of the Trans Canada Trail Society. The exhibits are now arriving from across Canada and should help educate us about the grandeur and breadth of our great nation. In the main booth, Linda Dayan Frimer, a Vancouver artist, will exhibit the original oil painting *The Golden Journey* from which the first Trans Canada Trail poster was drawn. It will be flanked by two additional oil paintings depicting our western forest heritage. It is a stunning and powerful exhibit.

The Public Market merchants and Granville Island restaurateurs have worked together to set up an area

next to Isadora's to serve food to satisfy the hungry legions expected to attend. The retail merchants have collected hundreds of prizes to hand out and a lot of their staff have volunteered for the day.

There will be chalk art on the sidewalk in a rainbow of colours and six foot bubbles if you can blow that hard; foam ball tennis so you can hit the balls as hard as you want and bingo for those interested in a more sedate sport. All through the day there will be field games to challenge

those with tons of energy, a Penny Carnival to test skill levels and pyrodesiac flag performances to be watched by those of use who are experts at observing others (observing others perform is a completely under-rated and little appreciated skill).

The staff from False Creek Community Centre's Kindercare program are busily collecting donations for a fundraising Silent Auction. Be sure to stop by the lounge to place your bids.

In the Craft Alley there will be woodworkers, potters, muralists, yarn dyers, weavers, sponge painters and others. It is amazing to see how many talented individuals in our neighbourhood are digging in and coming out to exhibit and share with families on Canada Day.

The day's fun begins at 10:00 a.m. Official Opening Ceremonies for the Waterpark will be at 1:00 p.m. followed by the cutting and serving of two enormous Official Cakes.

No significant change in vehicle count onto Granville Island since 1984

Residents near the intersection of Anderson and Lamey's Mill Road are convinced the traffic at that corner has increased noticeably.

Cross traffic to and from 2nd Ave. has undoubtedly grown and the proposed traffic light at Burrard/1st Avenue would surely have encouraged more eastbound drivers to detour into the False Creek area. Apparently (and thankfully) this has been scrapped due to opposition from Kitsilano residents.

Al Nauss, Manager of Granville Island, attended the June meeting of the False Creek Neighbourhood Association and reported, to the surprise of many, that though the number of visitors and workers coming to the Island has grown, the average tally of vehicles travelling onto the Island (and, of course, leaving by the same route) has not changed significantly in twelve years - it is still between 9,500 and 10,500 per day.

C.M.H.C. surveys have nevertheless indicated a notable change in travel modes in the last five years.

60% of visitors used to arrive by car; now the number is less than 50% and most of those are Public Market shoppers. Ferry traffic across the Creek has increased and recently the numbers reported by the two ferry companies exceeded EXPO year figures.

Although the free No.51 bus service between the Island and Granville/Broadway is not heavily used, C.M.H.C. has no present plans to chop the \$100,000/year subsidy it pays for the service.

When asked if C.M.H.C. had considered acquiring land to provide off-Island parking and a shuttle service, Al Nauss stated there have been discussions about acquiring land near the Seaforth Armouries for this purpose but Federal departments are reluctant to release any space.



Vancouver we were amazed to see there is quite a variety of styles for this contraption which, for some in explicable reason, they call a *Teddy* Bag dispenser. Made of sturdy stainless steel they cost up to \$180, rolls of plastic bags extra.

We also learned from the Parks Board that Grandview Park has a contraption into which thoughtful people put their surplus plastics bags for dog owners to help themselves.

After a lengthier discussion than one would have thought the topic warranted, the conservation minded members around the table voted in favour of asking the Park Board to instal this economical recycling model in our park.

The Creek will be sure to make a big announcement when it arrives.

Now who volunteers to conduct Poop Disposal Workshops with the goose population?

The False Creek Neighbourhood Association members have taken the summer off. The Association won't meet again until September 4.

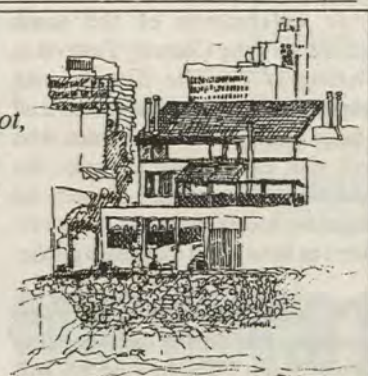

Granville Island's newly named Ocean Art Factory inaugurated by native artist Clarence Mills

Bill Reid's magnificent sculpture *Spirit of Haida Gwaii* looked so at home during the months it was on display on Granville Island last year it seemed a pity the rightful owners, Vancouver International Airport Authority, should take it away to the new terminal.

Many hoped the longhouse-like structure built to house it could remain and we are glad to hear that **Ocean Construction Supplies**, who generously donated the space for it, have agreed it will stay put for an indefinite period.

Now to be known as the Ocean Art Factory, the structure has been dedicated as a work-in-progress space for artists with a focus on, but not exclusive to, native art.

As is now fairly well known, renowned native artist Clarence Mills inaugurated the Ocean Art

Factory whilst he worked on a four metre totem pole commissioned by The Louvre, France's national museum and art gallery in Paris, for the Louvre's new permanent native exhibit.

The pole carving was open for public viewing in early June but it all happened rather quickly. Mills had to fly to Paris with the totem pole on June 13.

There will be ample opportunity to watch him at work on Granville Island in weeks to come. He has commissions to carve three more poles, for local clients.

Born in Skidegate in the Queen Charlotte Island, Clarence Mills is a member of the Raven Clan. He expresses the tradition of his culture in many forms including cedar, argillite, silk screens, gold and silver

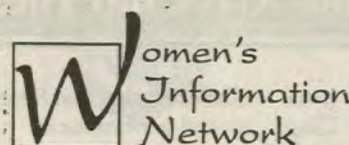
jewellery and poetry.

His past large scale work include totem carving at Expo 86 and EXPO 88 in Brisbane, Australia, and recent demonstrations in Europe.

He continues to donate his time and art to schools and fundraising benefits throughout B.C.

Clarence Mills has lived in False Creek for several years, just up the street from Stamps Landing Pub.

It is a matter of special pride to the 'local yokels' at Stamps Pub that the shirt for this year's Pendelakon Run was adorned by an original Clarence Mills design. In fact Mills donated two Haida designs. To ensure scrupulous fairness in awarding such treasures, the Pendelakon organisers decided all participants should have a chance; names were drawn so that one man and one woman went home with a signed, framed original.
